GARDEN

Our August speaker was from Searles, Kilcoy, Queensland. Important thing is to start from the roots by using the best potting mix. Check the expiry date as the fertiliser in the pack will only survive for six months. If you have ever walked on a bindii and felt the sharp pain they cause, this is the seed that has the prickles. Bindiis grow in the winter and set seed late winter to early spring. To kill bindii in lawns and to stop the spreading, spray them in winter as soon as you see them, before the prickles develop, and continue to repeat spray every three weeks until they are all gone. Repeat spraying is important as this will control weeds that germinate after the prior spraying. Our next meeting will be held on Tuesday 3 September, then Tuesday 1 October at 10am at Club Banora.
